Goals

1. Academic Average of 85% for all JROTC classes
2. Wellness Program Average of 85% for all JROTC classes
3. Color Guard presents the Colors at minimum 15 events
 - a. Will also include 1 high profile event
4. Schedule 2 different recruiting events
 - a. Gather a list of 30 prospective cadets for 2016-2017 school year
5. Unit has an average of 12 community service hours per cadet
 - a. Have at least 80% of unit participate in community service events
6. Participate in at least 7 events in conjunction with other schools in the district

Goal 1: 85% Academic Average

- Results:

- MP1: 82.68%
- MP2: 82.27%

- To help reach the goal, Kitty Hawk will be promoting their tutoring program more
- To encourage cadets to do their homework, which counts for a lot of their grade, new policies will be put in place
- In addition, Element Leaders are being instructed to take greater initiative to improve inspection grades

Goal 2: 85% Wellness Program Average

- Results
 - MP1 AVG: 88.74%
 - MP2 AVG: 90.53%
- Cadets overall have met the standard for wellness and have also shown improvement from marking period 1 to marking period 2

Wellness Program



- Runs once every seven school days
 - Planned by the Athletics Department
 - Executed by Flight Commanders or Athletics personnel.
 - Includes sports, drill, games, etc.
- Is running more effectively than last year due to more efficient and consistent planning as well as the lack of snow days

Goal 3: 15 Color Guard Events

- As of 2/24 we have surpassed our goal of 15 Color Guard Events with a total of 17 with 6 more pending
- The High Profile Event has also been completed with the Boys Wrestling GMC on the 29th of January



Goal 4: Schedule 2 Recruiting Events



- 8th Grade Experience
 - Got a list of 29 potential candidates for the 2016-2017 school year
- Next recruiting event is being planned by Operations

Goal 5: 12 Hours Average Per Cadet

- To achieve, unit would need a total of about 1200 hours by the end of MP3
- Currently have 766.66 hours
 - Kitty Hawk/Operations are planning numerous more events to get the final 400 hours in time
 - Events such as volunteering at the musicals, Knollwood, Senior Center trips, tutoring, and Garden Maintenance will help reach that goal



Kitty Hawk



- Organizes community service events for cadets to participate in.
- Currently has 25 inducted members
- Any cadet can participate in events.
- Official Kitty Hawk members are assigned into teams to maintain memorial garden every cycle (7 days).
- Events completed:
 - Haunted High School (170 Community Service Hours)
 - Can Drive
 - Pennies for Patients
- Tutoring and Garden Maintenance are being promoted to take effect on all cadets.
- Bigger events, such as Elijah's Promise and March of Dimes, are currently being planned for more community service activity.

Goal 6: Participate in 7 Activities With Other Schools

- Complete

 - 4 Events
 - Knollwood Elementary School
 - 3 Events
 - Schor Middle School
 - 1 Event
- More events are being planned
